From the President

Fellow AA&FGers,

AA&FG is proud to announce a NRA Chief RSO Instructor course scheduled for Sunday March 6. This is a one day class lasting 8 hours. Please view the Education and Training Section of this month's SCORE for more information.

The 2A community lost a champion with the passing of Justice Scalia last month. Words cannot describe what his presence meant on the Supreme Court for the Second Amendment. Scalia was often seen at the Fairfax Rod and Gun Club, where he was a member. At least once, he took an anti-gun Justice out for a round of skeet (we should all try to take new shooters or anti's out for a round of skeet/trap/sporting clays). Scalia wrote the Heller decision for the majority and I could only imagine he fought tooth and nail with the anti-gun Justices for the final result in that case. The Heller decision in 2008, and subsequently the McDonald decision in 2010, held that the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution applies to federal enclaves (Heller) and states (McDonald) and protects an individual's right to possess a firearm for traditional lawful purposes, such as self-defense within the home. Both rulings were split 5-4 based on the political leanings of the Justices.

How it is possible for nine highly educated people to hear the same court cases yet come to different conclusions based primarily on political beliefs is beyond me. Had the court been composed of one

2016 GUN BILLS DAYS ARE NOW SCHEDULED!

Please view the Associated Gun Clubs of Baltimore (AGC) Legislative Report (Available here: http://www.associatedgunclubs.org/legislative/2016_Session/Action_Alert.pdf) on the 2016 Gun Bill Hearings in the Maryland Senate and the Maryland House of Delegates.

Gun Bill Day Schedule:

Senate: Wednesday, March 9, 2016 @ 1:00 PM (16 bills to be heard)

House: Tuesday, March 15, 2016 @ 1:00 PM (27 bills to be heard)

The Gun Rights organizations (AGC, MSRPA, MSI, NRA-ILA) have pretty much established the positions of the organized 2A community on the 43 bills currently scheduled for hearings. Many of these bills are pro-gun bills submitted by pro-2A Delegates and Senators and are well deserving of your support. However, many others are not pleasant at all and some are downright odious! The Senators and Delegates on the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee and House Judiciary Committee need to hear from you that these odious bills need to be voted down if they come to a committee vote. Likewise, those "good" pro-gun/2A bills need to be supported and given a favorable vote if it comes to that. One of these bills will mandate universal background checks for ALL long gun (shotguns and rifles) sales and transfers, even between friends and neighbors. You will be required to go to a licensed FFL to get the background check done (standard Form 4473-based NICS check) for whatever transfer fee the dealer wants to charge.

Another bill will consider all muzzleloaders (originals and reproductions) and all pre-1899 antique firearms as firearms that are subject to the same background check requirement and other regulations as for modern firearms.

more left-leaning justice in 2008 or 2010, it is most certain that the Second Amendment would have been effectively gutted. Now with an open seat on the Court, Scalia's replacement is crucial since, at the time of his passing, there were four solidly left-leaning Justices and four mostly right-leaning Justices with one swing Justice who was not consistent either. There is a fight brewing today in the US Senate, the body that confirms the President's nomination for Supreme Court Justices. One theory is that the Senate, which has a Republican majority, will stall a current Presidential nomination until after the 2016 Presidential election in November. If this holds true, the fall election is really about the makeup of the Supreme Court for the foreseeable future. One more left-leaning Justice nominated to the court soon would change this country in many ways. More than likely, the next President will nominate more than one new Justice as well. I just want our membership to be informed about how important elections are and know that elections do have consequences.

You are all urged to attend the Gun Bill Day hearings and voice your concerns about the bills being heard. Details on the rest of the bills can be found at the AGC legislative VP's page at <http://www.associatedgunclubs.org/legislative.html>. Sign up for the newsletter so you get up-to-date info about current bills in the House and the Senate.

In addition to attending the hearings and giving testimony to voice your opinion to the committees, there are other important actions that you can take. Review the list of Senate and House Committee members and contact info listed at the AGC Legislative Vice President's website here: http://www.associatedgunclubs.org/legislative/2016_Session/Action_Alert.pdf, and send them letters, make phone calls, send emails, or best yet...especially if any of the committee members are **your Senators or Delegates**, make an appointment to pay them a personal visit in their office to express your feelings on these bills – both the good and bad ones.

Constituent visits (by appointment, please) rank pretty high with both Senators and Delegates even if they've "already made up their mind", since you vote and can probably influence a quite a few more votes. Letters - handwritten or typed - come next. You took the time to formulate your thoughts, put them into a coherent letter, and buy postage. **Phone calls** – especially if you are call your Senator or Delegates - are pretty good too since you time out of your busy schedule to make the call. Make your call brief but to the point since your call will probably be answered by a staffer who may not be very conversant with the nature or details of the bill(s). Details are not necessary, just whether you support or oppose the bill – use the bill number (HB or SB) and state your position. **Emails** rank last. Basically, the sheer volume of emails often results in nothing more than a count being taken (something like 573 for, 9,846 against). Don't just copy and paste text from various sources. Either simply say you're for or against the bill(s) or **in your own words** say why you oppose or support the bill, how its passage will affect you, your hobby/sport, & your family. As House Judiciary Committee Chairman Joe Vallario is fond of saying at the opening of his committee hearings – "tell us how you feel from the heart" - don't just read a dry prepared statement devoid of emotion.

Since this is not a Sanctioned Weekend, we will leave several firing positions open for club members wishing to do informal rifle shooting while we conduct this match.

I was organizing my reloading room while snowbound during the recent blizzard, and came across a stack of old AAF&G Newsletters, (even before it was called the SCORE). I found this article from our old Black Powder Pistol matches in the February 1998 issue and I have reproduced an excerpt from it:

"We had 8 shooters show up on Saturday, January 3rd. **Tom & Sue Ferris** and **Guy Bellanca** all posted high scores. The remaining 5 shooters, **Henry Real**, **Bill Palk**, **Mike Krofchick**, **Tom Outerbridge**, and yours truly (**Dennis Conroy**), were in a tight competition for the remaining slots, and shot within a few points of one another. Once again, Guy brought out his .44 caliber Remington-style buffalo revolver with the 12-inch barrel. Wyatt Earp would've loved it. Henry Real shot his original 1860 Army Colt...he had not shot his 1860 Colt for 30 years! Henry is a competitor and is getting

the cap 'n ball bug again, so I'm sure he will be back for future blackpowder shoots."

Sadly, **Henry Real** is no longer with us...he was a very friendly man and helped me immeasurably when I was getting the Action Pistol program off the ground, welding target bases for me for only the cost of materials. Tom & Sue Ferris and Dennis Conroy moved out of the area years ago. Tom & Sue are the ones who got me hooked on Black Powder shooting. Dennis was relentless in his attempts to unseat Tom from his position as monthly match winner. The first time I had ever seen the legendary massive Walker Colt was when Bill Palk brought one to a match. They were all there when we first started these matches in the 90's and were around for things like the time we set the range on fire (it was only smoldering and quickly extinguished), the time Dennis brought everything to the match but black powder (we gave him some so he could shoot the match), the reaction from other shooters the first time I uncased that buffalo revolver on the firing line, and others. That really brought back some fond memories for me, and I'm glad to see the interest in Black Powder shooting still exists here at the club.

EDUCATION & TRAINING

NRA Chief Range Safety Officer(CRSO) Instructor Class - March 6, 2016 at AAFG

Prerequisites: Class is **ONLY** open to **CURRENT NRA RSOs** or **CURRENT NRA INSTRUCTORS**. Class hours are 9am to approx. 6pm. This is a one day, 8 hour class.

NRA Instructors without NRA RSO credentials must take the online RSO course before March 6 (available anytime online). NRA RSOs who do not have any type of NRA Instructor Rating must take the the NRA Basic Instructor Training (BIT) class before CRSO credentials are conferred; BIT can be taken after CRSO. The BIT class is held quite regularly, this CRSO class is difficult to find.

The CRSO certification is an instructor course which will allow successful students to teach NRA RSO classes. Class is open to current AAF&G Members and invited guests of members.

Cost is \$250. Prepayment is required to register, please contact AAFG Training for details. Preregistration is required to attend. To register please email AAFG.Training@gmail.com.



Announcing a Bullseye Pistol Clinic

Anne Arundel Fish and Game Association and the Twelfth Precinct Pistol Club are hosting an introductory bullseye pistol clinic at Anne Arundel Fish and Game Association's range in Annapolis on April 9-10, 2016. This clinic will teach you everything you need to know to get started in the great sport of bullseye pistol shooting.

Each day will include classroom instruction and several hours of range time with experienced shooters helping you to develop and refine your technique. You will come away from this clinic with the training you need to participate in bullseye matches, all the bullseye instructional materials you will ever need, and a plan for continuing to improve your skills. Although this clinic is designed primarily for shooters with little or no experience in bullseye competition, marksman and sharpshooter class bullseye shooters are welcome and will have the opportunity to improve their skills and learn from some of the best bullseye shooters in Maryland.

To find out more, turn this page over for details and contact information!

What You Can Expect:

Saturday morning will begin with talks on firearms safety, the basic rules of bullseye competition, and an introduction to the fundamentals of pistol marksmanship. We will then proceed to the range for orientation and slow fire practice. After a break for lunch, we will resume with discussions of bullseye equipment and an introduction to reloading, and then return to the range for sustained fire practice. Sunday morning will include classroom sessions on advanced fundamentals, goal setting, mental preparation, and training for continuous improvement. All classroom sessions will include plenty of time for questions, and during range time you will work one-on-one with an experienced coach. Sunday afternoon will be devoted to additional range time, allowing you to pull together all that you have learned over the weekend. Shooters will leave with a good understanding of how to compete and succeed in bullseye pistol matches. Note – due to range restrictions, all shooting will be done with .22 pistols only!

Registration Fee:

The fee is \$60.00, or \$15.00 for juniors (ages 16-20), and includes all instruction, course materials, and lunch both days.

Contact Information:

Space is limited and pre-registration is required. To reserve a space, send your name, address, phone number, e-mail address, age (if under 21), and check (payable to John Hollingshead) to John Hollingshead at P.O. Box 1245, Olney, Maryland 20830. For more information, contact John at bullseyeclinic@hotmail.com.

Age Requirements:

Minimum age to participate is 16. Participants under 21 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian (parent or guardian need not participate).

Dates and Time:

The clinic will be held (rain or shine!) on Saturday, April 9 from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., and Sunday, April 10 from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Directions:

The clinic will be held at Anne Arundel Fish and Game Association at 1730 Saint Margaret's Road in Annapolis (about 3 miles west of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge off Route 50). From Route 50 eastbound, take exit 28 (Bay Dale Drive) to the stop sign on the service road. From Route 50 westbound, take exit 28 (Bay Dale Drive) and cross over Route 50 to the stop sign on the service road. Turn left at the stop sign and proceed toward the Red Hot & Blue Restaurant (in the windmill). At the restaurant, turn right onto Old Mill Bottom Road. At the next intersection, turn right onto Saint Margaret's Road (Route 179). Continue 0.7 mile on Saint Margaret's Road to club entrance on the right, just before crossing Mill Creek. Park in the paved lot on top of the hill and proceed to the clubhouse.

And here's a continuing reminder to all Eccles HP range users: If you bring guests to the club, remember to have them fill out and sign a waiver before doing anything else. At

the Eccles HP Range, the blank waiver box is located on the wall on the right as you enter. And right next to it is the box for signed waivers (which has been emptied so there's room now for more signed waivers).

Here's something else to remember: This year March is the month when we'll fire up our charcoal burning front stuffer smoke poles and begin our series of muzzle loading rifle and pistol matches for 2016. Although most of the matches will be scheduled on the Sanctioned Weekends as they were last year, remember that last month we said that we were going to get a jump-start on them this year for rifle matches at least, and so, our first muzzle loading match of the year will be a Muzzle Loader Rifle match on Saturday, March 12 at 1000. Since this is not a Sanctioned Weekend, we will leave several shooting positions open on the Eccles HP Range for any informal shooters that may want to fire those newfangled breechloading thingys. If we have a crosswind, we will be sure to put them on the downwind side of the range, (cough, cough).

Any muzzle loading rifle is welcome be it traditional side hammer, inline, percussion lock, or flintlock. If it loads from the front it's welcome. More details concerning the match – targets, distance, time, number of rounds needed, propellants, sighters allowed, sighting systems, etc will be provided closer to the date.

IDPA was fun!


We had four IDPA matches in February. All of the matches were well attended in spite of the cool weather. For some unexplained reason, we seem to enjoy our winter matches.
