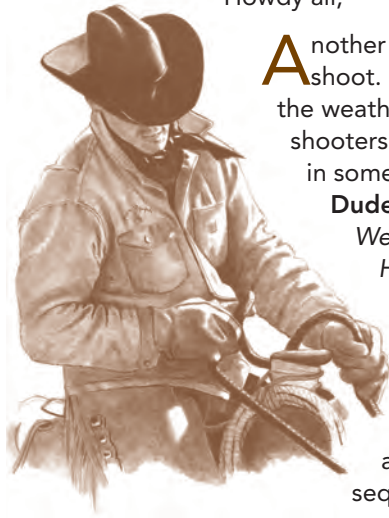

There are a lot of shooting opportunities for those who wish to enjoy. The next NRA registered event is a 2700 on October 11<sup>th</sup>. Shooting begins at 9:00 am. This match is the first part of the AAF&G / 12<sup>th</sup> Precinct "Iron Man"

tournament. The second part of the tournament is another 2700 shot at 12<sup>th</sup> Precinct on October 12<sup>th</sup>. It takes a lot of bullets and even more stamina to prevail in the Iron Man!

There will be an Army L match on October 25<sup>th</sup>. Be there at 8:30 AM to guarantee a place on the line in these popular matches. Army L matches are terrific for getting your feet wet in Bullseye competition, as the targets are larger and slow fire is at 25 yards. The 22 caliber match starts at 9:00 am and is followed by the center fire match.

And, of course, our regular league matches are every Thursday at Noon and Saturday at 9:00 am. These feature .22 and center fire matches. Finally, there is a practice and training session every Tuesday at 10:00 am. Come out and join us.

## Rimfire Action

Our August match marked 2 years since we started our Rimfire Action Shoots. The cool sunny September-like weather we had this year made me think back to that first match in August 2012. What a difference! We had torrential downpours and ankle-deep mud. Thunder & lightning eventually ended that first match early, 23 shooters toughed it out and left with smiles on their faces, vowing to return. And they have returned. We have had a total of 474 shooters, averaging about 20 per month, even through some brutal winter weather, the continuing rimfire ammo shortage, and a few muddy spring thaws.

We had 25 shooters including a few first-timers for our August match. When the day was done, **Bob Yurwitz** finished first with a total time of 53.20, **Jim Stansbury** was second with a 66.08, and **Walt Romain** finished third with a 67.52. Nobody shot a clean match this month. Full results were sent out to the RAS GMail group and will be posted on the website. We will have results for the Sept. 28<sup>th</sup> match next month. Upcoming matches include our Ladies Only Clinic and Match on Oct. 5<sup>th</sup>, regular matches on Oct. 26<sup>th</sup> and Nov. 23<sup>rd</sup>, and a trial run for an NSSF Rimfire Challenge match on Nov. 9<sup>th</sup>. This NSSF match will only have 3 strings per gun per stage instead of 5 strings.

I need to cover this next topic so please bear with me. We have been having some shooters show up late for matches. This has become chronic, and it is generally the same people. We publish our match times but maybe it bears repeating:

- 9:00am – Setup
- 10:00am – Registration
- 10:45am – Safety Briefing
- 11:00am – Match begins

All shooters must attend the Safety Briefing to shoot the match, whether you are a novice or an expert. This should be a fun event, but safety is paramount above all else. In addition to the safety considerations, there are 20+ shooters who arrived on time and are waiting to shoot the match. There are also a handful of us who set up the match, register shooters, make the shooting order, run and time the shooters, and ensure safety throughout the match. Please be considerate of your fellow shooters and arrive at the range in time to be registered before the Safety Briefing at 10:45 am. Thank you all. We appreciate your attention to this matter.

## Club Matches

The next Service Rifle/MSR/Any Rifle subject to the FSA of 2013 (except M1A) match – Oct. 4<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon.

The next **Vintage Military Rifle Match – Oct 11<sup>th</sup>** (BULLROAST DAY, too!) from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon and will be for manual semiauto Rifles.

New **High Power Rifle Match** shooters should consider arriving NLT 9:30 am in order to familiarize themselves with the course of fire and get guidance in use of the sling. A 5 minute unlimited sighter sighting-in period will precede the record fire phases. For details on high power rifle match requirements, please visit the web page at <http://aafg.org/events.html>.

With a change of venue to accommodate more shooters, the next Rimfire Sporter Match will be held at the **Carpenter-Showacre Smallbore Range** on Saturday, October 11<sup>th</sup> at 1300 hrs. The smallbore range will accommodate up to 13 shooters in each course. All that is needed is a semi-auto, bolt, lever, or pump action .22 rifle with any sighting system and weighing less than 7.5 pounds and 80 rounds of .22LR ammo. Shooters begin at 50 yards with a sighting or practice series and then shoot ten shots for record slow-fire (10 minutes) in the prone position, followed by two five-shot rapid-fire series (25 seconds each). This is followed by ten shots slow fire and two five-shot rapid-fire series in the sitting or kneeling position. Targets are then placed at the 25-yard line where shooters conclude with ten shots slow fire and two five-shot rapid-fire series in the standing position. Targets have a 1.78" ten-ring and an 18" outer one-ring. Even new shooters can get hits on this target, but it's still tough enough that no one yet has fired a perfect 600x600 score. The Rimfire Sporter course of fire is challenging, new shooters can successfully complete it while experienced shooters find it uniquely challenging. If you have your own shooting mat please bring it along. The fee is \$5.00 for targets. If you plan to shoot, please e-mail Fred Fare at [cavalla.244@verizon.net](mailto:cavalla.244@verizon.net).

## Eccles Range Improvements and Upgrades.

If you haven't been to the rifle range recently you won't have noticed that due to the efforts of **John Kerrigan, Steve Barney, Roy Hatch, Paul Fries, and Andrew Blischak**, the exterior of the pavilion has been painted with a primer coat to prevent deterioration of the plywood sheathing. The color was actually supposed to be a bit darker (just can't seem to get 4 quarts of paint and a pint of tint into a gallon bucket),

but it serves well as it is to blend nicely with the surrounding vegetation. But this is just the primer coat...the final coat is coming and will even better allow the pavilion to blend, especially with the fall and winter colors coming.

We are also in the process of making it possible to mount a pair of oscillating fans to move the air on those warmish and humid summer days (maybe not so much this year) and to put some light over the shooting benches on dark days. Planned for the near future will be wall-mounted rifle racks, gear shelves, and benches in order to reduce gear clutter and make better use of available floor space. Watch this space for schedules as the time draws nigh.

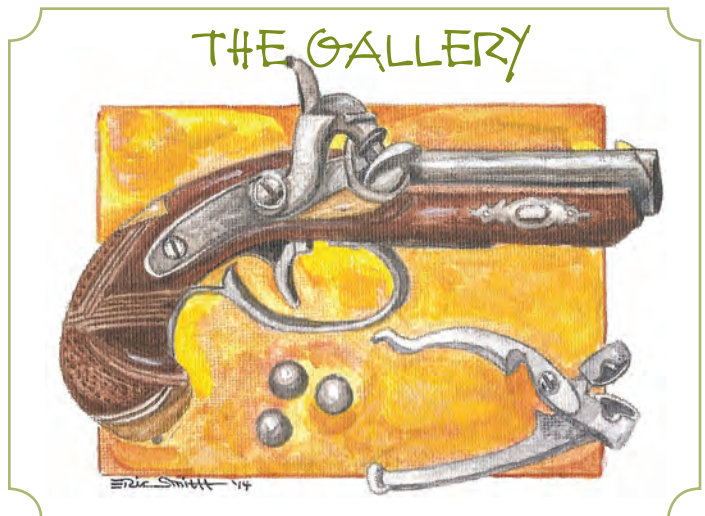
Start cleaning out the safe and attic and bring your stuff to sell to fellow members at our Flea Market. You don't even need a table, any blanket will do.

## HUNTER SAFETY



As noted in last month's *SCORE*, AAF&G will again be hosting two field day sessions for those who have taken the Maryland DNR Hunter Safety Class on-line. The field day sessions will cover Ethics, the Law, Firearms (hands on), and Treestand safety in the classroom. Following the classroom training, students will then go on the hunter safety trail where they will demonstrate safe firearms handling, determine appropriate (and safe) cartridges for firearms, demonstrate safe fence crossing techniques, and observe a variety of safety, legal, and ethical hunting scenarios. Following the hunter safety trail the students will participate in a live fire exercise (either a shotgun or a .22rf rifle exercise depending on range availabilities.) Then they will take the final examination and, if they pass, will be issued their DNR Certificate of Competency in Firearms and Hunter Safety which allows you to purchase a hunting license. This certificate is valid in all 50 states and in all Canadian provinces.

The dates scheduled for these field days are October 18<sup>th</sup> and November 22<sup>nd</sup>. If you have taken the on-line course, passed the on-line exam, and received a certificate, then you should go to the DNR website and register for the AAF&G course (if you want to take it here at your club).

Additionally, we will soon be soliciting for new Hunter Safety Instructors to continue teaching Hunter Safety programs at AAF&G. Like hunting? Like teaching? Like teaching kids? Like teaching kids about hunting safely? Boy, have we got a deal for you!

In order to become a full-fledged, bona-fide, card-carrying DNR-sanctioned and approved Maryland Hunter Safety Instructor, you simply need to fill out an application form, pass a criminal history background check conducted by Natural Resources Police, and take a brief training/indoctrination training session offered by DNR, and then you can be a part of the AAF&G Hunter Safety teaching team. And you get a neat hunter orange polo shirt with embroidered logo, to boot! Like I said, such a deal!

DNR provides all the materials you need to teach the class. You will have to provide your time, teaching skill and enthusiasm. You will be able to teach as many classes as you like (some clubs teach as many as 10-15 classes a year), or as few (we used to teach 4 classes each year but now can find time and instructors only for two at most). There are also two types of classes...the traditional 10 hour minimum classes usually spread over two 3½ hour evening sessions and one five hour Saturday session...and the newer on-line class field day which requires only one Saturday session of about five hours.

So, for those of you who indicated on your renewal (and initial application) forms that would be interested in volunteering for the hunter safety program and for any other interested members, your chance will be coming. Soon we

will be sending you an email to which we will append the information you will need to embark on this worthwhile endeavor.

Final note: Ever since DNR began the online Hunter Safety classes there have been more students completing the online portion and needing the field day portion to obtain the Hunter Safety certificate needed to get a Hunting License. DNR calculates that statewide there is a waiting list of over 1500 students who need the online class. That's over 1500 potential hunters who will be buying licenses, guns, shells, gear, etc. Remember, the number of hunting licenses issued is used as an indicator of hunting interest and that number has been slowly dwindling in Maryland. And while for a variety of reasons (urbanization, lack of game, lack of hunting land, lack of time, lack of training) it

may be dwindling somewhat from its heyday, if folks can't get a hunting license because they can't find a class to take, they definitely will lose interest and maybe take up another hobby/sport. Then those diminished numbers of licenses are used by anti-hunting organizations (and legislators) to opine that Marylanders aren't interested in hunting anymore. Plus, the Pittman-Robertson funds which are generated by sales of hunting licenses and hunting gear and given to Maryland by the US Fish & Wildlife Service get reduced. Those funds are used to acquire more hunting lands in the state. So, for want of a nail...we get diminished hunting in Maryland. Bottom line: if you want to help out, then respond to the email when it comes out.
